Marylebone Village is located in the heart of central London and is much more than just your typical high street. Just moments from the hustle and bustle of Oxford Street, the village is easily accessible by foot, taxi or public transport, with multiple London Underground and mainline stations only a short walk away.

Renowned restaurant Caldesi has been offering the Marylebone community a truly authentic Italian dining experience for over 18 years, with an informal downstairs café, a more adventurous menu upstairs, and an Italian cookery school in the courtyard.

50 Marylebone High Street

With its independent one-off stores, revered brands and curated seasonal edits, Marylebone Village offers fashion, beauty and wellness experiences to suit all tastes.

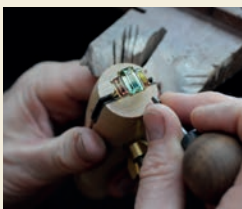

Pharmacist to Her Majesty the Queen since 1958, this health and beauty emporium offers hundreds of luxury beauty products and in-house treatments.

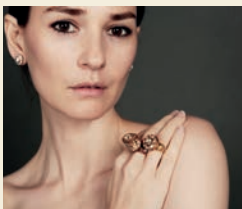

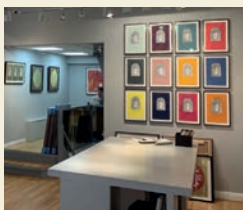

Village History

Discover the rich and varied history of Marylebone Village, including where the name comes from and things to look out for during your visit.



History

The village of Marylebone took its name from the Tyburn—the brook that continues to flow beneath its streets, heading to the Thames—and the local church of St Mary. St Mary's on the Bourne became St Marylebone. In the 18th century, what had previously been a rural village began to be built up into the elegant grid of streets we know today.



The Elm Tree

At the top of Marylebone High Street you will find a Huntingdon elm tree that is thought to be some 150 years old. As well as surviving the ravages of Dutch elm disease, the tree also narrowly avoided a World War II bomb, making it the last elm tree standing in Westminster. It is still thriving, producing flowers every year.



The Wallace Collection



Gifted to the nation in 1897, The Wallace Collection contains masterpieces of painting, sculpture, furniture, arms, armour and porcelain, collected in the 18th and 19th centuries and now displayed in a magnificent Marylebone townhouse on Manchester Square.
